EYFS Curriculum: There are seven areas within the Early Years Curriculum that cover all aspects of your child's learning. The three Prime Areas are essential and underpin the four Specific Areas. The children learn by 'playing and Exploring' (engagement) being an 'active learner' (motivation) and 'creating and thinking critically', these are the characteristics of learning. We differentiate activities by considering the age and stage of each child's development.

General Reminders

Drop off – Please arrive at Pre-School no later than 9.10am (morning session) and by 12.05pm – this allows us to begin our activities without disruption.

Collection – Please arrive to collect your child at 12noon latest and afternoon children at 3pm. We do recognise that traffic may be a problem, please allow plenty of time to park or pull over and call to let us know if you are running late. Persistent lateness will occur a late collection fee.

Clothing – Please provide a pair of wellington boots that can be kept at Pre-School and a warm coat. Please name all items.

Bag – Your child should only bring one small bag with them to Pre-School. Please provide spare clothing, nappies and wipes if required and a named water bottle. Lunch Boxes – No nuts, chocolate bars or popcorn please. All grapes/sausages/blueberries must be cut length ways

Snow Protocol

A closure notice will be delivered to you by 8.00am. In some instances, a decision to delay the opening time will be announced to allow staff to travel safely. Closure will be notified by email, through our Facebook page and website. If the forecast suggests heavy snow whilst your children are at Pre-School, we will phone you and advise you to come and collect your child. Please also use your own judgement.

This term, the children who are leaving for Reception in September 2024 will begin spending time in HHIS Reception class. This process helps support the children with the transition from Pre-School to Infant School. The children who are staying in Pre-School next year will continue with adult led activities in Pre-School.
